

2026 Brixhibition Kids Completion FAQ's

Entry & Eligibility

Q. How can I enter the Brixhibition Lego Competition?

A. You can only enter through a participating primary school or community group.

Q. What aged children can enter the Brixhibition Lego Competition?

A. Any child from Kindergarten to Grade 6 can enter.

Q. What are the 4 age groups?

- Kindergarten - Prep
- Grade 1-2
- Grade 3-4
- Grade 5-6

Q. Can high school students participate?

A. No. The competition is only open to Kindergarten–Grade 6 students.

Q. Can I enter the Brixhibition more than once?

A. No. Each child may only enter once through their school or community group.

Rules and Requirements

Q. Is there any costs to enter the Brixhibition Lego Competition?

A. No. Entry is completely free.

Q. Is there a time frame?

A. Yes. Please check your school or group's Terms and Conditions for dates.

Q. Are there any themes in the Brixhibition Lego Competition?

A. No. Students may build anything they imagine.

Q. Are teams allowed?

A. No. All entries must be individual.

Q. Can I build from a Lego kit or non-Lego kit?

A. Absolutely not, we want to see original ideas and imagination in the creations.

Q. Can I build from Lego instructions or non-Lego instructions?

A. Absolutely not, we want to see original ideas and imagination in the creations.

Q. Is Duplo allowed?

A. Yes. Duplo is made by Lego and is allowed.

Q. Are non-Lego brand bricks allowed?

A. Yes, as long as they are Lego-compatible.

Q. Are moving parts, motors, and lights allowed?

A. Yes, but batteries may not last the full 2-day event if your entry is selected.

Q. What is the maximum size creation allowed?

A. Maximum size is 52 cm wide, 52 cm deep, 52 cm high, or four 32x32 baseplates arranged in a 2x2 formation. All parts must fit within these limits.

Judging and Winning

Q. What are age group winners?

A. Each school or community group may choose one winner per age group.

Q. What is the overall winner?

A. One overall winner is chosen from the age group winners. They will represent their school or group at the Brixhibition event and compete for the Grand Prizes.

Q. Can I build my Lego creation at school or at home?

A. Yes. You may build your creation anywhere.

Prizes

Q. What are the local school or community group prizes?

A. Age Group Winners: Medallion + free passes to Richmond Gaol, Leven River Cruises, and Beaconsfield Heritage Museum. A. Overall Winner: Special Overall and Age Group Medallion + free passes to Brixhibition and possibly an extra surprise prize.

Q. What are the grand prizes?

- 1st Place: Trophy + \$300 Toyworld voucher
- 2nd Place: Trophy + \$200 Toyworld voucher
- 3rd Place: Trophy + \$100 Toyworld voucher
- 4th Place: Trophy

Q. Can schools provide other prizes if they want?

A. Yes. Schools and community groups may offer additional prizes.

If I Win...

Q. If I'm picked as the overall winner from my school or community group, then what?

A. The Overall Winners Parent/Guardian will be asked to fill in and sign an Entry/Permission form. (The competitions organiser from your school or community group will provide this). After the fully completed and signed Entry/Permission form is returned back to the Brixhibition Competitors co-ordinators, then the overall's winner parent/guardian will be contacted directly by phone, to arrange drop-off and pickup of the winning Lego creation to and from the Brixhibition Event. (or to make alternative arrangements)
